Goal

The goal of the Vision Care Outreach Program (VCO) is to reduce the incidence of unnecessary vision loss and impairment by providing access to a donated system of comprehensive vision care services for uninsured and underinsured families in Ohio.

Participating Referring Partner Agencies

Referring partner agencies benefit from the vision care outreach program so they can offer valuable eye care service to their clients. Partner agencies are typically social service organizations and schools such as homeless shelters, detention centers, drug/alcohol rehabilitation services, free clinics and health departments – that serve clients with multiple challenges in their lives. Number of Northeast Area Residents Served

Last year, Prevent Blindness coordinated access to donated eye exams, eyeglasses and follow up surgical care to 342 Northeast Ohio area residents that would have not been able to access services otherwise.
